The Berkshire Breeders Club will give a **Special Rosette** to the **Best Berkshire pig** which will qualify for the BERKSHIRE BREEDERS CLUB CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS 2010. The Champion of Champions to receive a Perpetual Challenge Trophy, presented by Wiltcombe Berkshires. Should the Best Berkshire pig have already qualified at a previous Show, then the Reserve should go forward, as no pig may qualify more than once. In the event of the Reserve having qualified, then the judge should nominate another pig for the Final.

The Gloucestershire Old Spots Pig Breeds Club have nominated this Show as a qualifier event for the Newbury & Royal County of Berkshire Show on September 15th & 16th. The animal judged to be the Best of Breed at this event will automatically be eligible to go forward to the final judging and arrangements will be notified by the Club. A Best of Breed rosette is offered by the Club. Note that only the qualifying pig may enter the finals and that in the event of its not being available or by virtue of its qualifying at more than one event, no substitute may be made.

- P2 A SPECIAL PRIZE OF £10 is offered by the British Lop Pig Society for the Best Group of 1 Boar and 2 Sows or Gilts. £6 to the Reserve. The British Pig Association offer Rosette for the Best Pig.

Food chain information with commercial entries for slaughter must be handed to Chief Pig Steward at the Show.

A Grand Final for Young Handlers will be held at the Hatfield Country Show in August. The Final will consist of two age classes - Junior Young Handlers 8 - 12 years of age and senior Young Handlers 13 - 17 years of age.

Winners of Young Handler Competitions at BPA sponsored shows throughout the year will be eligible to compete in the final. If a young person has already qualified for the Final they should inform the stewards. The next highest placed competitor who has not already qualified will be eligible.

All handlers attending the final must be BPA members. Junior Membership is available.

At the Final the judge will test the Young Handlers ability to control and display their pig and may also test each exhibitors knowledge of pedigree pig breeding.

This competition is open to all Breeds and Pig persons may parade any one of his/her animals that has been entered in the Show Classes.

This competition is designed to improve the technique of parading and displaying pigs before a judge. It will be held at 1000 hrs on the final day of the Show, Saturday June 12th.
