- Class 1 Three Onions Over 250g  
Class 2 Three Onions 250g or under  
Class 3 Ten Shallots, large exhibition  
Class 4 Ten Shallots, pickling max. 30mm  
Class 5 Two Leeks, blanch  
Class 6 Four Potatoes, white  
Class 7 Four Potatoes, coloured  
Class 8 Three Carrots, stump rooted  
Class 9 A Pair of Marrows, maximum 400mm  
Class 10 Three Beetroot, globe  
Class 11 Two Cucumbers, grown under protection  
Class 12 A Trug of Vegetables  
*A collection of Vegetables displayed in a trug. Not more than five varieties. The exhibit should be arranged effectively and herbs may be used for decoration. Trug not to exceed 75cm x 50cm*
- Class 13 Any Other vegetable, two large or five small  
Class 14 Three Apples, dessert  
Class 15 Three Apples, culinary  
Class 16 A Vase of Mixed Flowers, five to ten stems, taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants. Only foliage growing naturally from the flowering stem and still attached will be allowed.
- Class 17 A Vase of Chrysanthemum, three disbud blooms  
Class 18 A Vase of Chrysanthemum, three stems sprays  
Class 19 A Vase of Dahlia, three single blooms, Giant and or large (over 170mm diam)  
May be staged in 3 vases or 1 vase
- Class 20 Dahlias one vase three blooms medium and/or small (over 100mm, no more than 170 diameter)
- Class 21 Dahlias one vase, three blooms miniature and/or pompom (up to 100mm in diam)
- Class 22 Children under 12 years. An animal made from vegetables  
Class 23 Children under 12. A vase of three single flowers one or more kinds  
Class 24 Young people 12 years to 16 years. A vase of five single flowers one or more kinds  
Class 25 Young people under 17 years. A plate of four vegetables one or more kinds

## **REGULATIONS**

- 1. Judging on Saturday 30th September 2017 at 8.00am.** Exhibitors and the public will not be admitted to this section until judging is completed. Judge's decision will be final.
- 2.** Exhibits to remain on view and intact until after prize giving on Sunday 2nd October, when they are to be removed. Any items still on the premises on the following day will be disposed of by the Society.
- 3.** Entries close on Monday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2016.
- 4. Staging on Friday 29th September between 4.00pm and 7.00pm.** Exhibits to be cleaned and trimmed before being brought to the Show.
- 5.** Covered Trestle table(s) will be provided.
- 6.** No sale of produce permitted until close of Show.
- 7.** Each person entering will receive one free admission ticket. Admission tickets will only be given upon receipt of exhibit. Further tickets may be purchased at the gate (reduced rates for OAPs and free entry for children under 16 accompanied by a paying adult ). Car parking is free.
- 8.** Exhibitors are expected to comply with the instructions of the Stewards.
- 9.** The entire risk and responsibility as regards all exhibits and in reference to all consequential or other injury or loss arising therefrom or thereto, must be borne by the Exhibitor. The Society will not be responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit, in whole or in part, from any cause.
- 10.** The Society reserves to itself by its Council and Committee, the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations and arbitrarily to settle and determine all matters arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show. Also to refuse or to cancel any entries and to postpone or abandon the Exhibition.
