(Rule 13 not applicable) Recipe: • 225 g (8 oz) honey. • 225 g (8 oz) S.R. flour. • 113 g (4 oz) butter or margarine. • 2 eggs. • 113 g (4 oz) sultanas. • 113 g (4 oz) currents. • 60 g (2 oz) mixed peel. • 45ml (3 tablespoons) milk. • A pinch of nutmeg. • A pinch of salt. Method: • Cream butter/margarine and honey. • Sift flour, nutmeg and salt together. • Beat eggs and add to the creamed mixture alternately with flour. • Add rest of ingredients & beat lightly, adding milk if needed to form a soft dropping consistency. • Bake in a greased 18 cm (7 inch) round tin on the middle shelf at 150°C (gas mark 2) for 1¼ - 1½ hours.		£5.00	£3.00	£1.50
18.	Honey Biscuits (10 to be displayed) - made to recipe & by method below. (Rule 13 not applicable) Recipe: • 50 g margarine. • 100 g plain flour. • 50 g Caster or soft brown sugar. • Pinch of salt. • 1 dessert spoon of honey. Method: • Cream margarine, sugar & honey together. • Sieve salt & flour and work into the creamed mixture. • Knead until smooth. • Roll to 6 mm (¼") thick, cut into rounds 60 mm (2½") dia, prick with a fork. • Place on greased baking sheet & • Bake for about 10 min at 180°C, gas mark 4. • Allow to cool a little before removing from baking sheet. • Store in an air-tight container.		£5.00	£3.00	£1.50

RULES AND REGULATIONS PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. Entry Registrations must reach the Hon. Show Secretary, no later than 16th September 2023. Entries received after this date will only be accepted at the discretion of the Hon. Show Secretary. Exhibits received will not be staged if fees have not been paid.
2. Fees are payable either upon registration by Bank transfer:
Bank a/c: SEAS, Account No: 01265561, Sort Code: 30-18-30,
Ref: BEES [+entrants Surname]
or upon delivery of exhibits to the show:
either by cheque (payable to South of England Agricultural Society) or in cash.
3. All exhibits must be presented to the Bees and Honey Section, South of England Showground, Ardingly, West Sussex RH17 6TL. Each entrant will be offered a car pass for showground access on Friday 22nd September between 9am and 5pm. Alternatively, entries may be delivered by courier or post (carriage or postage paid) to arrive by Thursday 21st September. Payment for return carriage or postage and all charges must be made when sending exhibits. No return carriage will be paid by the Society.
4. Numbered Exhibitors' labels must be affixed to exhibits as follows: Jars and Mead bottles, 15mm from bottom; Frames, one in top right hand corner of the vertical face of the container and one on the frame's top bar; Cut Comb, one on the right-hand corner of the lid and one on the long side of the container; Beeswax, one on the exhibit and one on the bag provided; Cakes & Biscuits, one label to be affixed to the plate & one to the bag provided; Displays, so as to be completely visible.
5. No exhibit may be entered in more than one class. Exhibitors may make more than one entry in a class, but will not be awarded more than one prize in a class.
6. A Novice is any beekeeper who has never won a first prize at a Honey Show, the First Prize winner of Class 3 being eligible for a free Admission Ticket to the National Honey Show.
7. Frames must be shown in bee-proof protected cases with the comb to be visible on both sides.
8. Extracted honey must be shown in B.S.I. Pattern glass 1lb. Squat jars of one type and secured against leakage with standard metal or plastic caps.
9. Cut Comb must be shown in standard commercial containers.
10. Beeswax, honey cakes and biscuits must be shown only in polythene bags which will be provided.
11. Mead must be shown in clear, un-tinted glass punted wine bottles of 70cl capacity, shallow punts will be accepted. Plastic flanged cork stoppers must be used; flush corks must not be used.
12. Every possible care will be taken of exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur in any way whatsoever, or for exhibits not collected at the close of the Show.
13. All honey exhibits to be products of the Exhibitor's bees.
14. The Judges have the power of withholding the prize from any exhibit through insufficient merit of entries.
15. Candles must be displayed erect in or on suitable holders, so that one can be lit by the Judge. (Beeswax may be purchased for candles).
16. Exhibitors wishing to buy their gifts may do so at selling prices prevailing at the time of the Show, and must indicate their intention on the entry form. Gifts reserved in this way must be paid for and collected before the end of the Show.
17. No exhibit or any part thereof shall be removed before 4.30pm on the last day of the Show, and shall be checked against the entry form and removed by a Steward.
18. Any Exhibitor submitting 5 or more Show entries will receive a FREE entry wristband valid for both Show days. An entry to class 1 will count as 5 entries. An entry to Classes 17-20 will count as 2 entries. Note that the full Adult Day Ticket price will be £ 13.05 (£11.25 for senior citizens) and under 16's go free if accompanied by an adult.

SHOW GROUND ACCESS & PARKING

Dropping off Exhibits (or Honey Stock for Sale) on Friday.

Each entrant will be offered a car pass for access to the showground on Friday 22nd September *See Rule 3*

Parking during Show Days

All visitors, Honey Show Exhibitors and Stewards are required to park in the public car parks surrounding the Show Ground.

Note: There is no vehicle movement on the showground between 8.30am and 6.30pm each show day, Sat. & Sun.

Collection of Exhibits & Prizes (or Honey Stock & Sales proceeds) on Sunday.

For Entrants walking into the showground (eg. from a public car parking area), to collect exhibits or prizes; access is permitted from 4.30pm. **See Rule 17**

For entrants requiring to bring their vehicle into the showground to collect exhibits (or Honey Stock); vehicle access will not be permitted before 6.30pm.

Exact time of vehicle access would depend on the pedestrian footfall on the showground, and be the decision of the Chief (Showground) Steward.
