## Schedule of Classes

### VEGETABLES

- Class 1 Three Onions, Over 250g  
Class 2 Three Onions, 250g or under  
Class 3 Six Shallots, large exhibition  
Class 4 Six Shallots, pickling max. 30mm  
Class 5 Two Leeks, blanch  
Class 6 Four Potatoes, white  
Class 7 Four Potatoes, coloured  
Class 8 Three Carrots  
Class 9 A Pair of Marrows, maximum 400mm  
Class 10 Three Beetroot  
Class 11 Two Cucumbers  
Class 12 Any Other Vegetable not included above - two large or five small of single kind  
Class 13 Five Tomatoes, small. To pass through 30mm ring.  
Class 14 Three Tomatoes, medium. To pass through 60mm ring.  
Class 15 **Novice Class.** Exhibitor who has not won a place card at any Horticultural Show  
A plate of four vegetables, one or more kinds.  
Class 16 A Trug of Vegetables  
A Collection of Vegetables displayed in a trug. Not more than five kinds. The  
exhibit should be arranged effectively and herbs may be used for decoration.  
Trug not to exceed 75cm x 50cm.  
Class 17 A vase of culinary herbs, three named varieties

### FRUIT

- Class 18 Three Apples, dessert  
Class 19 Three Apples, culinary  
Class 20 Any Other Fruit not included above - two large or five small of single kind

### FLOWERS

- Class 21 A vase of mixed flowers containing between five and ten stems taken from a  
minimum of two different kinds of plants. Only foliage growing naturally from the  
flowering stem and still attached shall be allowed.  
Class 22 A Vase of Chrysanthemum, three stems. Only foliage growing naturally from the  
flowering stem and still attached shall be allowed.  
Class 23 A Vase of Dahlias, three stems. Only foliage growing naturally from the flowering  
stem and still attached shall be allowed.  
Class 24 A Cactus in a pot, any size pot may be used  
Class 25 A Pot Plant grown for foliage effect  
Class 26 A Pot Plant grown for flowering

### CHILDREN'S CLASSES

- Class 27 Children under 17 years. A plate of four vegetables, one or more kinds.  
Class 28 Children under 12 years. Three single flowers, one or more kinds.  
Class 29 Children 12 to 16 years. Five single flowers, one or more kinds.

### FUN CLASS – FOR SEAS EMPLOYEES AND FAMILY MEMBERS ONLY

- Class 30 Any Vegetable and/or Fruit. - two large or five small of each kind. Refer to  
Regulations 3 for specifics.

## REGULATIONS

1. All exhibits to be the property of and be grown by the exhibitor.
2. Only one exhibit per class per exhibitor permitted except for Classes 12 and 20 where two exhibits per exhibitor will be permitted.
3. Class 30. There are no restrictions as to what exhibitors may enter.
4. **Judging: Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> September 2024 at 8.00am.** Exhibitors and the public will not be admitted to this section until judging has been completed. Judge's decision will be final.
5. Exhibits to remain on view and intact until after prize giving on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> September, when they are to be removed. Any items still on the premises on the following day **will be disposed of by the Society.**
6. Entries close on **Monday 16<sup>th</sup> September 2024.**
7. **Staging: Friday 20<sup>th</sup> September between 4.00pm and 7.00pm.** Exhibits to be cleaned and trimmed before being brought in.
8. Covered Trestle table(s) will be provided.
9. **No sale of produce permitted until close of Show on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> September.**
10. Each person entering will receive one free admission ticket at staging on **Friday 20<sup>th</sup> i.e., Admission tickets will be given only on receipt of exhibit.** Further tickets may be purchased at the gate or online at [seas.org.uk](https://seas.org.uk). 11. Exhibitors are expected to comply with the instructions of the Stewards.
12. The entire risk and responsibility as regard to all exhibits and in reference to all consequential or other injury or loss arising therefrom or thereto, must be borne by the Exhibitor. The Society will not be responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit, in whole or in part, from any cause.
13. The Society reserves to itself by its Council and Committee, the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations and arbitrarily to settle and determine all matters arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show. Also to refuse or to cancel any entries and to postpone or abandon the Exhibition.
14. No NVS member exhibiting in the NVS 2024 National Championships may enter an exhibit into the SEAS Horticultural Show.
