Conditions of Entry

- The competition is free to enter.
- KS1, KS2 & KS3 (ages 5 – 14) are invited to take part.
- Entries can be a team/class/individual effort, but must be in separate Key stages, except for Category 4, which can be a collaboration of all ages.
- No more than 1 entry per Category 1 and 4 can be submitted for each KS1, KS2 & KS3 group.
- No more than 3 entries per Category 2 and 3 can be submitted for each KS1, KS2 & KS3 group.
- Category 4 may have mixed key stage entries and ages.
- You will need to provide your own materials.
- Category 1 – A model showing a farmer's field growing either barley, oats or wheat. Must be no larger than 60cm by 35cm.
- Category 2 – A poem showing the use of barley, wheat and oats in food and/or drink (e.g. barley is used to make beer, wheat is used to make bread and oats for porridge). Must be no longer than a page of A4 paper.
- Category 3 – A picture showing the 4 stages of crop growing : Planting, growing, harvesting and finally showing what the crop could be used for (e.g. wheat is used for bread or pasta). Must be no larger than a page of A3 paper.
- Category 4 – A dreamcatcher showing the use of any dried or freshly grown crops of barley, wheat and/or oats. Must be no larger than 50cm in length and width
- All entries must be clearly marked with School name/name of entrant, Key stage Group you are entering and Category (ies) you are entering.
- If entries are not clearly labelled, they will be withheld from being judged.
- We will not be accepting photo entries for Category 1. We will need to see the physical model for judging.
- Items must be delivered by 5pm on the 4th June 2025, as judging takes place on Thursday 5th June 2025, at 10am sharp.
- Entries will be displayed during the South of England Show 6th, 7th and 8th June 2025 in 'The Countryside Hub' - the education stand in 'Discover the Countryside' area.
- A prize will be awarded to the winner of each category for KS1, KS2 and KS3. Entries will be judged using the following criteria: Creativity, quality, presentation and information.
- All decisions of the judge(s) are final.
- Entries may be photographed and displayed on the SEAS website and used for Marketing and PR purposes.
- Schools will be advised of the procedures for delivering and collection of entries nearer the time of the show.
- Please note that SEAS will endeavour to take every care of your entries, but we can't be held responsible for them while they are at the Showground.
